

Other activities to complete after watching the clip:

- Dig a burrow in your garden
- Play throw and catch like the meerkats in the film (rugby)
- · Draw fruit and vegetables you have in the house
- · Research where meerkats live
- Count pomegranate seeds (in a picture)
- Make fruit from playdoh/ craft clay
- Collect feathers and make a collage of the vulture

Questions to ask:

Pause the film after 56 seconds when all of the meerkats have come outside.

Where are the meerkats sleeping at the beginning?
How many of them are there?
Why do you think they are sleeping huddled together?
Describe the setting outside in three sentences.
What are the meerkats looking for when they come out of hibernation?

Pause the film after 1:33 after the vulture has spotted the fruit.

What does the fruit look like?
How do you imagine it to taste?
If the meerkats could talk, what might they say to each other as they stare at the fruit in the tree?
Why do they hide as the vulture lands on the tree?
Do you think the vulture is going to let them have the fruit? Explain your answer.

Pause the film at 3:44 when the vulture thinks he has won. How do the meerkats react to the vulture taking the fruit? Which sport does their formation and actions remind you of?

Explain how they work as a team to retrieve the fruit. Think of five words to describe the how the vulture moves.

At the end of the clip ask... What happened to the fruit? How? Who do you think won?

Note: there are no answers for these discussion questions.

This is a verb poem. It tells the story of what happened in the clip. Use some of your verbs from the grid and create your verb poem on the next page.



What about if each of the eight meerkats had two babies back in the burrow? How many meerkats would there be altogether then?

Can you draw the other half of the meerkat? Be careful with this tail! Don't give him two!

Sentences


Have a look at the pictures below. Write a sentence about each one. Can you put an adjective (describing word) in each?







3 colours = 6 combination

Pink skin, yellow flesh, black seeds Pink skin, black flesh, yellow seeds Black skin, yellow flesh, pink seeds Black skin, pink flesh, yellow seeds Yellow skin, pink flesh, black seeds Yellow skin, black flesh, pink seeds

8 meerkats + 8 baby meerkats = 16 meerkats

8 meerkats + 16 baby meerkats = 24 meerkats

8x2 = 16

8x3 = 24
